This year we celebrate the Ojibwa Indian Heritage



The Ojibwe are one of the most populous and widely distributed Indian groups in North America, with 150 bands throughout the north-central United States and southern Canada. *Ojibwe* and *Chippewa* are renderings of the same Algonquian word, "puckering," probably referring to their characteristic moccasin style. "Chippewa" is more commonly used in the United States and "Ojibwe" or "Ojibway" in Canada, but the Ojibwe people themselves use their native word *Anishinabe* (plural: *Anishinabeg*), meaning "original people." Today there are 200,000 Ojibwe Indians living throughout their traditional territories.
